MANITOBA COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE AWARDS

ASSINIBOINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE BURSARIES

\$500 - \$1,500 (ten or more awards)

Selection is based on financial need. You must be entering or continuing in a certificate or diploma program as a full-time student.

Deadline – Dec 1 (after graduation)

ASSINIBOINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENTRANCE AWARD

\$2,500

Decisions will be based on information from the following submissions: transcripts of high school education, a personal statement outlining how your experience has prepared you for success in your chosen career, and two letters of reference from people who can attest to the fact that you have demonstrated the skills, attitudes, and characteristics you need for success in your chosen program

Deadline – July 15 (after graduation)

BRANDON UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Approximately 25 awards at various amounts (\$200 - \$5,000)

Criterion varies depending on the scholarship or bursary. Academic abilities and/or financial need are considered. All scholarship and bursaries require a BU Scholarship Application to be submitted, except the Board of Governors Entrance Scholarship. The entire list is available at the following link:

Brandon University Board of Governors Entrance Scholarships

Scholarship eligibility will be based on grade 11 marks if students apply to BU before March 1 and send their transcript. Scholarship offers could be increased if grade 12 marks are higher, but they will not be reduced. Students who apply after March 1 shall have their scholarship eligibility assessed on grade 12 final (June) marks.

- Tier 1 – Average greater than or equal to 95% - \$2,000
- Tier 2 – Average greater than or equal to 92.5% - \$1,700
- Tier 3 – Average greater than or equal to 90% - \$1,400
- Tier 4 – Average greater than or equal to 87.5% - \$1,100

CONCORD COLLEGE AWARDS (Christian university affiliated with U of W and Canadian Mennonite University)

ACADEMIC ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

\$1,000 - \$2,000 (seven awards)

Awarded for highest overall marks. No scholarship application necessary, only admission application.

MUSIC ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

\$1,000 - \$2,000 (three awards)

Students must have an 80% or better average, submit and audition cassette, and submit Toronto Conservatory or Western Board grades.

ALUMNI ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR LEADERSHIP

\$1,000 (five awards)

Students must have demonstrated in their secondary years significant leadership in school, community and church, while maintaining a high level of academic performance.

Deadline - April 1

HERZING COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

up to \$600

The scholarship program is available to all Manitoba High School graduates. They must be in the top 50% of students accepting into a Herzing program and they must have a recommendation from their high school.

Deadline - April 30 for \$600 (decreases after that date)

MENNO SIMONS COLLEGE (affiliated with U of Winnipeg and Canadian Mennonite University)

Menno Simons College offers a number of \$300 scholarships to students registered at Menno Simons College. They are awarded on the basis of academic performance and need.

Deadline - May 28

These scholarships are awarded on a basis of an audition.

RED RIVER COLLEGE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

\$500

Available to students entering a full-time program. Selection is based on English 40S, Math 40S, and two additional 40S courses. Also, check their scholarship handbook for additional entrance scholarships and bursaries. Some do not require an application, some require the General RRC Scholarship Application, and others require specific application forms.

\$1,500 (2 awards)

Available to women planning to enroll in any of the following programs: Aircraft Maintenance Engineer, Carpentry, Collision Repair and Refinishing, Electrical, Manufacturing Technician, Outdoor Power Equipment Technician, Power Engineering Technology, Plumbing, Precision Metal Manufacturing, Refrigeration, Welding or Wood Product Manufacturing. Applicants must have satisfactory academic progress, a strong work ethic and financial need. An essay and a reference letter are required.

ARTHUR UNIACKE CHIPMAN ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

\$1,000 (two awards)

Academic achievement and leadership qualities will be considered. Financial need or mature student status may be a factor in selection.

H. IRVINE GRAHAM ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,000 (two awards)

The successful candidate will have demonstrated exceptional academic promise, diversity of interest and potential for leadership.

Deadline - May 1

C.C. LANDON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$200

Presented for highest marks obtained upon entry to a full-time program at the U of M. You must have joined St. John's College by September 10.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF THE NORTH

\$500 (20 awards available)

Students must have a 70% average, be involved in community activities, be a conscientious student, and maintain a full time course load at Keewatin Community College.

UNIVERSITÉ DE SAINT-BONIFACE

Entrance Scholarship – General

\$750

Grade 12 average must be 80% or higher using French 40S, Math 40S, and one other 40S course. Students will be entering their first year with the exception of Bachelor of Education or Bachelor of Business Administration students.

Entrance Scholarships Academic – Francofonds
\$1,000 (five scholarships)

Grade 12 average must be 90% or higher using French 40S, Math 40S, and one other 40S course. Student must demonstrate dedication to the Francophone community of Manitoba.

Deadline – September 30 (after graduation)

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA ACCESS PROGRAM

A support program that provides access to a university education for people who otherwise would not have had the chance for such experience because of social, economic and cultural reasons, lack of formal education, or residence in remote areas. Preference will be given to persons of Aboriginal ancestry, residents of Northern Manitoba and low income earners. Access also includes a Special Premedical Studies Program for those interested in health care careers. Funding is usually pending.

Deadline - March 1

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA AGRICULTURE AND FOOD SCIENCES CENTENNIAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,000 (seven awards)

This scholarship will be awarded to Manitoba high school students who plan to enter the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences at The University of Manitoba. Eligible students may enter either the two-year Diploma in Agriculture program or the four-year Bachelor of Science degree program. Students entering the degree program must register for a specific set of courses in University 1 as determined by the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences and as outlined in the university STARTbook. Applicant must have a minimum average of 75%, provide a résumé, and briefly outline their vision for rural Manitoba and their career goals.

Deadline – April 1

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA AGRICULTURAL AND FOOD SCIENCES GFTC LEGACY FUND

\$4,000 (3 awards which can be renewed for one year)

Students must apply for admission to the B.Sc. Food Science program in the Faculty of Agricultural and Food Sciences and meet the direct entry requirements. A letter of application is needed.

Deadline – May 1

U OF MANITOBA ATHLETIC AWARDS

\$500 - \$1,500

Student must be playing for the U of M on one of its CIAU teams. Further information is available from the university coaches.

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA BURSARIES

For all bursaries administered by the U of M, a single application, duly completed, will be considered for any award for which the applicant may be eligible. Student must show financial need (usually will have applied for a student loan).

Deadline - October 1 (of 1st year university)

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA CHOWN CENTENNIAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000

This award is offered to the best "all-around" graduate who is planning to attend the U of M. The student must have an 85% or greater average calculated on courses listed for admission to the U of M.

No application necessary - selected by the school scholarship committee

Criteria are focused on high academic achievement in Senior 4 courses. They are awarded to students registering at the U of M who have five 40S subjects which are on the designated scholarship list. No application necessary, however, student must apply to U of M before March 1.

UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA FACULTY OF ENGINEERING ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

\$500 redeemable at U. of M. Bookstore (80 awards)

These awards are available to students who have attained a high academic standing (math, physics, and chemistry) and who are entering the Faculty of Engineering at U. of M.

No application necessary**UNIVERSITY OF MANITOBA FAIRFAX FINANCIAL HOLDINGS LIMITED ENTRANCE AWARDS**

\$5,000 (3 awards, renewable for three additional years)

This award is available to students registering at University of Manitoba and who have a minimum 80% average, and have demonstrated financial need based on a government student loan assessment and have completed a University of Manitoba bursary application. <http://umanitoba.ca/student/awards>

Deadline – July 10 (after graduation)**U OF MANITOBA - LEADER OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIPS
and INDIGENOUS LEADER OF TOMORROW SHOLARSHIP**

\$16,000 (six or more awards of \$4,000, renewable for three more years at \$4,000 per year)

The successful candidate will have achieved at least 90%, have demonstrated leadership qualities, have demonstrated a high level of communication skills, have a record of school community involvement and have demonstrated other special abilities (ex: artistic, athletic, literary).

Deadline - December 1**UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG – GREAT WEST LIFE AWARD**

Tuition for three years, summer employment, and full time work after graduation

This award is available for students applying to the U of W Bachelor of Arts in Applied Management Studies.

Deadline – March 1**UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG MAJOR ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

Students can only hold one Major Entrance Scholarship and will not normally be eligible for any other entrance scholarships offered by the University. The school can nominate one student for these awards. See Mrs. Cousin if you wish to be considered for nomination.

\$5,000 (6 to 10 awards)

Criteria are focused on high academic achievement, participation in extra curricular activities and leadership qualities.

Walter Leatherdale Entrance Scholarship

approx. \$28,000 (\$7,000 x 4 years)

This award will be given to an outstanding student from rural Manitoba, preferable from a farming community.

Marsha P. Hanen Entrance Scholarship

\$10,500 (\$4,500 in year 1 and renewable for three years at \$2,000)

Criteria are focused on high academic achievement, participation in extra curricular activities and leadership qualities.

Deadline – Dec 1**UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG – OPPORTUNITY FUND BURSARY**

up to \$5,000

This award is for academically promising students who are attending U of W but have a financial need, and who come from a population currently under-represented at the U of W. A special application form is needed.

Deadline – September 15 (after graduation)

UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG OTHER ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS, AWARDS AND BURSARIES

amounts vary (\$200 to \$4,500)

The criterion varies depending on the scholarship or bursary. An entrance scholarship application must be completed and it lists the available awards.

\$1,000

Husky Energy's awards are available to anyone of Aboriginal ancestry in Canada, who possesses suitable academic qualifications, is in need of financial assistance and demonstrates a career interest in the oil and gas industry. Letters of reference and an essay are required.

Deadline – May 31

ALAN B. BEAVEN FORESTRY SCHOLARSHIP

\$500

Available to any student pursuing a career in forestry or an allied field.

Deadline - July 31 (after graduation)

ALBERT NIKULASSON MEMORIAL BURSARY

\$300

The successful candidate of this award must have an identified learning disability and be pursuing full-time post-secondary education in Manitoba.

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL HOTEL MANAGEMENT AWARDS - MANITOBA HOTEL ASSOCIATION

\$1,000

The student must be enrolled in a 4 year course in Hotel Management - University of Guelph or Ryerson Polytechnical in Toronto, University of Calgary, University of Victoria - and have a strong desire to return to Manitoba. Applicants need academic proficiency and an interest in the Hospitality Industry.

ALPHA OMEGA WOMEN'S ALUMNAE BURSARY

\$1,125 (four bursaries)

ASSIGNMENT SAVING LIVES BURSARY PROGRAM

\$3,000 for university students or \$1,500 for college students (renewable)

If you are of Aboriginal ancestry you are eligible to apply for this award. You must be a citizen of Canada and a resident of Manitoba. You must be enrolling in a Manitoba college or university as a full-time student. You must have financial need.

Deadline - March 15

CANADA POST SCHOLARSHIP

\$2,000

The scholarships are open to all children of full- and part-time employees of Canada Post Corporation. The graduate must have a 78% average and leadership involvement in the school or community.

Deadline - May 15

CANADA'S OUTSTANDING YOUNG FARMERS - MAJOR JAY FOX MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

\$500

An annual scholarship will be presented to recognize a student continuing in the field of agriculture who has made a significant difference in their communities. An essay is required. Preference will be given to those students pursuing a field of study related to agriculture or to those acquiring trades training that would be beneficial to the rural economy.

\$1,500, renewable for three years

This award is available to female students who are Canadian citizens or permanent residents and who are applying to university or college in fields of business, sport management, or marketing. Criteria: have an average above 85%, be an accomplished athlete, and demonstrate the Olympic values of excellence, leadership, respect, human development, fun, fairness, and peace. References and an essay are required. www.coa.ca

Deadline - January 31

CBC DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP MANITOBA

\$1,000 (two awards)

This award is available to visible minorities or aboriginal students who are entering the field of journalism or television/radio/website production at a university. A minimum average of 70% is needed. An essay is required.

Deadline - May 20

CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS OF MANITOBA SCHOLARSHIP

\$1,000 (4 awards)

Awarded to a graduate who has an overall average of 80% or better in their Senior 2 - Senior 4 courses, and who is involved in school and community activities. The student must have shown an interest in a career in a business field and who is continuing their education in a business faculty at one of Manitoba's universities.

Deadline - March 27

COACHING MANITOBA BURSARY

\$500 - one to a male student and one to a female student from the rural area

Students who are, or will be, enrolled in the upcoming year in post-secondary education and currently coach for a school, club, or community centre can apply. You must have a 60% minimum course load in post-secondary, and be currently coaching and plan to continue coaching. NCCP training is an asset. Essay required.

Deadline - April 30

CRI YOUTH LEARNING GRANT (A MANITOBA CREDIT UNION PARTNER)

\$1,000 (4 awards in Manitoba)

Any graduating student who is a member of a Manitoba Credit Union is eligible to apply for a Learning Grant. Selection is based on academic, artistic, and athletic achievements as well as community involvement.

C.S.T. CONSULTANTS GURUPARAN AND WINSOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

\$6,000 (one male and one female recipient)

These scholarships are available to Canadian citizens who are academically gifted, well-rounded, and will be pursuing their first undergraduate commerce/finance/business degree/diploma at a recognized post-secondary institution. This program is aimed at those students whose parents do not have a post-secondary education or received their post-secondary education outside of Canada.

Any active junior curler entering or in post-secondary education may apply if affiliated as a junior during year of application. Selection is based on curling achievements, academic achievement (minimum average 70%), and school and community involvement. Two letters of recommendation are required.

Deadline - May 1

DALE IWANOCZKO MEMORIAL VOLLEYBALL SCHOLARSHIP

\$750 (2 rural awards, 2 urban awards)

Applicants must be proceeding to post-secondary. Scholarships will be awarded to individuals who have shown leadership in amateur sport, have well rounded skills in volleyball, a minimum of 65%, and participation in school and community activities.

Deadline - December 6

EF EDUCATIONAL TOURS GLOBAL CITIZEN AWARDS
