

Hello Teachers,

Today I did water colour painting with the Aboriginal students at lunch time. I created a mountain template based on Coast Salish weaving design. This art activity was inspired by Sto:lo artist, Carrielynn Victor, and Coast Salish blankets. Please see photos below. This art can tie into math: using patterns to colour the mountain or measuring angles using a protractor. You can also tie this into any lessons you are doing on landscape, nature, weaving, Coast Salish people, etc. The sky is left blank, so students can paint the sky with clouds, sunsets, or the night sky. They may also draw eagles or ravens soaring in the sky.


### Booking
