

# FIELD TRIP CONSENT and ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RISK – Downhill Skiing/Snowboarding Trips

Completion of this form is required for student participation in a skiing/snowboarding field trip. Parents will have also read and signed the *Field Trip Consent Form 6031-04*. It is understood by all parties that the following rules will be strictly enforced as part of the field trip.

1. All students and supervisors on ski/snowboard trips are required to wear helmets at all times while snowboarding or skiing. Snowboarders are also required to wear wrist guards.
2. **Beginning-level snowboarders and skiers (those having less than three full days of experience)** -- Students at this level are required to take lessons at the beginning of the day before accessing the hill, and the instructors will determine which areas of the mountain they will be allowed to access. Some students may be limited to lower-mountain lifts and easier runs.
3. **Intermediate-level snowboarders and skiers (those having at least three full days of experience) or advanced (very experienced, expert skiers or boarders)** -- Students at these levels are required to take lessons as early in the day as the resort can accommodate. Until completing their lessons, these students are restricted to lower-mountain lifts.
4. All students are strictly forbidden from entering terrain parts or other areas of jumps, rails, chutes, etc., and from venturing out of bounds.
5. Any student found to be in contravention of rules, particularly with regard to helmets, wrist guards, lessons, terrain parks, dangerous or risky behaviour, or being out of bounds, will have his or her privileges revoked immediately for the remainder of the day. Further measures will be taken as necessary in terms of disciplinary action at the school, and parents will be informed.
6. Students will abide at all times by the direction of trip supervisors and patrol staff that work for the resort. This includes students who are not skiing or boarding, but are involved in other activities such as luge, tubing, cross-country skiing or outdoor survival skills training.

**As a condition of the student's participation in this field trip, the parent or guardian acknowledges the risks inherent in this activity. These include the student's personal injury or death resulting from any cause whatsoever, including but not limited to the use of ski lifts; collision with natural or man-made objects, or with other skiers, snowboarders or other persons; separation from the group, exposure to the elements, and travel within or beyond the ski area boundaries.**
