Dear Trustees,

We are writing this letter to express our concern that, as one of your stakeholders, DPAC Executive has not been asked to meet in regards to the 2016-2017 budget. Our District is facing a large deficit that will require cuts, yet by mid-April, there have been no decisions made as to what these cuts will be. As well it has been said that we will be facing deficits of up to \$2 Million and \$1.8 Million in the following years. So far, there have been no actions taken to resolve the shortfalls.

As District Parent Advisory Council, we are requesting that you, as Trustees of this District, make your plans for addressing the budget shortfall known to all interest groups, including parents, as soon as possible. There is too much speculation, and not enough actual information floating around with regards to the budget shortfall. Please respect the time and needs of parents. You have the ability to provide stability and leadership in this challenging time, yet the perception is that you seem to be avoiding the tough decisions instead.

One option that has been talked about is the alternative calendar but at this point no decision has been made. Parents must know what challenges they need to prepare for next year: will they be required to find daycare for Friday afternoons with the 4.6 school week model? Will parents need to prepare their children for the possibility of changing schools, if a school is to be closed? For some children, changing schools is a traumatic event and parents need time to work with their children to alleviate anxiety.

By delaying and deferring decisions, you are denying parents the opportunity to prepare themselves and their children for the challenges that are coming. The District needs to make changes now. We are looking to the Trustees for leadership. This means that possible school closures may need to be deliberated. It may also mean that boundary changes need to happen in the fall...unfortunately with a harder implementation than previously considered. These decisions should be made now and not delayed until September.

We are aware that other districts around the province are facing similar challenges. Some have chosen to close schools, while others have chosen to keep all of their schools open. The districts that have chosen to keep all of their schools open are now closing programs, severely impacting their student population. We are very concerned that the current delay in deciding on a solution may create a future loss of opportunity for student achievement.



- Ian Heselgrave, Dan Dalgleish and the Maintenance Department must be commended for their exceptional work in completing the house
- To move forward with final details, programming and purchases such as appliances, furniture, kitchen wares, linens etc. and to further involve our community partners we recognize the need to name the house/program.
- We are pleased to inform you that the house has been named "Mawhinney House" in memory of Lock Mawhinney, long serving SD # 71 Director of Student Services and community advocate for the rights and needs of those students with special needs.
- Lock Mawhinney began a lengthy professional career in the Comox Valley in 1964 and was a teacher, consultant, coordinator, supervisor and eventually Director of the large and diverse department serving the needs of students with special needs. He was an advocate for the rights of all students to fully access appropriate educational services in inclusionary environments. Lock spent the majority of his thirty-four year career implementing this goal in the challenging and rapidly changing field of disability education. He led the school district from segregated to inclusionary practice. Throughout his career he received a number of Provincial Awards for his work in Special Education. Lock retired from the School District in 1998 to become the founding Community Leader of L'Arche Comox Valley and held the position until a second retirement in 2002.
- Lock Mawhinney was an inspirational leader, visionary, mentor and innovator. Alongside his
 colleagues he worked tirelessly for the inclusion of the developmentally disabled into broader
 educational opportunities and the community at large.
- Mawhinney House will be an added resource to our community, allowing our students another
 opportunity to bridge from school to community.

Issue:

The purpose of this brief note is to provide an overview of the proposed FY 16-17 AFG spending plan to the Finance Committee.

Facts and Background:

It is anticipated that the Ministry provided AFG funding for FY 16-17 will be the same as the previous FY at \$1,618,173.00.

The purpose of the AFG funds is to preserve and extend the life of school district facilities. The three key priorities for AFG funds are: Health and Safety, facility changes to meet educational needs and to address critical maintenance needs.

Planned projects – The proposed submission list to the Ministry of Education is included as an attachment. More significant projects include:

- VOIP phone system installation at Robb Road;
- Replacement windows at Miracle Beach Elementary;
- Bathroom upgrades at Courtenay Elementary;
- Roof replacement work at Brooklyn Elementary;
- Replacement Big Toy at Valley View Elementary;
- Classroom rebuild at Highland;
- Gym floor refinishing at NIDES;
- Contribution to the Vanier Seismic Upgrade Project;
- Boiler plant upgrade at Lake Trail; and
- Exterior repaint at Glacier View and Puntledge.

There are numerous other planned projects that will be undertaken as well. All projects are considered against the measures of how they will preserve and extend the life of SD 71 facilities. Attention to building envelope maintenance and following prioritized work plans to a common standard is emphasized throughout the maintenance and capital program. It should be noted that this is plan may change if the funding envelope changes or due to emergent maintenance pressures or concerns.
