Treasurer’s report:

Principal’s Report:

School Review:

There will be some changes at Glacier View next year. Key program (grade 8-9) and Senior Alternate identities will be dissolved. Classes will be composed of a combination of students from grades 8-12. The Bridgeway behaviour program might be moved to Lake Trail school; this is to offer more elective opportunities for students in that program. Bridgeway would turn into a half day program with half of the day being spent at GV and the other half being spent in Lake Trail.

There will be 4 teachers at Glacier View next year. If Bridgeway moves there will be 3 teachers.

There is a need for more Aboriginal content in English and Social Studies. We will be having some Aboriginal educators coming in to work with our teachers to develop some content.

The district is looking at giving Glacier View more counselling time next year. They want to have a career counsellor: WEX, liaison with NIC etc...

There is a possibility that Glacier View will be running classes from Monday to Friday next year.

Wellness Centre:

The grand opening was on Wednesday, April 26th at 12:00 pm. Trustees, VIHA, JHS, Superintendent, Assistant superintendent, some staff and students and the newspaper were in attendance.

Some services include a Navigator and a Sexual Health nurse.

A physician, Janice McLaughlin has started providing her services.

There will be a link put on the websites of all of the schools to promote awareness about this valuable resource.
