



ADMINISTERING MEDICINES TO STUDENTS

Sunrise School Division expects that under typical circumstances medication prescribed to students should be dispensed before and/or after school hours under the supervision of the student's parent(s)/legal guardian(s).

If a practising physician determines that a particular student requires medication in order to attend school and that medication must be taken during school hours, the division approves the procedures contained in JLDC-R – Medical Protocol for Administering Medicines to Students, which must be implemented by the principal.

JLDC-R – Medical Protocol for Administering Medicines to Students is a guide and a resource for families, human service practitioners, educators, medical personnel and others who must collaborate to provide reliable and effective supports to children who live with special medical needs. JLDC is adapted from the Manitoba Family Services Unified Referral and Intake System (URIS) manual. This guide does not provide instruction in health care procedures. Individual planning and child-specific training are necessary.
