Learning a second language

### Tips for Parents of French Immersion Students

The following suggestions for parents of children enrolled in the French Immersion program are taken from the Canadian Parents for French brochure "How to be an Immersion Parent."

- Read to your child in English. Reading skills transfer from one language to another.
- Your child may not be able to translate words at an early stage
- Taking your child to French cultural events or events hosted by the Beausejour Chapter of CPF will help expose them to French language and culture.
- Resist the temptation to correct your child if you are uncertain of the exact pronunciation or expression.
- Volunteer in the classroom or at special eventseven if you don't speak French!
- Remember that no two students and no two teachers work at the same rate so try not to compare your child's progress to other children.
- Resist the temptation to say, "Now dear, say something in French to Grandma". If your child is eager to speak French at home, encourage it, but do not make it a chore.
- Keep a positive attitude. Express any concerns you have to your teacher or principal not to your child.
- Do not worry if you aren't bilingual! The teachers do not expect you to speak French and will be able to answer your questions and provide support to you in English!



Even though your child is registered in French Immersion you may still have questions about the program. CPF-Beausejour Chapter members are here to help!

#### You may be wondering...

French Immersion is for everyone. With few exceptions, Immersion is suitable for all children. Any child who can learn to communicate in one language can acquire a second language through the French Immersion Program.

French Immersion is designed for families whose mother tongue is not French. **Parents do not need to know French** in order to help their children with homework. In fact, the teachers will communicate with you in English because they expect that you do not know French!

French Immersion students follow the **same Government of Manitoba curriculum** as the English students except they learn the material in the French language.

**Bus transportation is available** for students who wish to attend the French Immersion program in Beausejour including students from Garson and Tyndall.

At Beausejour schools, French Immersion is available from Kindergarten to Graduation. French Immersion grads have many options. They can study in French or English, at universities in Canada and abroad. Universities recognize French Immersion courses for admission. Scholarships and bursaries are available for study in French in other parts of Canada or abroad.

Graduates of a full Immersion program have an increased appreciation of other languages and cultures, enhanced career potential and a key to learning other languages. **It opens one more door for their future.**
