Six Things Absolutely Not tolerated at LdBSS:

- Words that offend a person's race, religion, gender, ability, etc.
- Aggressive Physical Contact
- Defiance of Rightful Authority
- Disrespectful Language and Gestures
- Behaviours that Detract from Others' Learning
- Any Form of Bullying or Intimidating Behaviour

Academic Integrity Code of Conduct

It is important that the work students at Lac du Bonnet Senior school are credited for is indeed their own, and has been completed with academic integrity as described below.

The following will not be tolerated:

Type of Misconduct	Definition	Examples
Cheating	<i>Using inappropriate or unacknowledged materials or study aids.</i>	<i>-copying work, using electronics when forbidden, 'cheat sheets', etc.</i>
Facilitating Academic Dishonesty	<i>Knowingly or negligently allowing your work to be used by others.</i>	<i>-giving answers, allowing peers to copy work and hand it in as their own, letting students copy your test answers, etc.</i>
Plagiarism	<i>Misrepresenting someone else's ideas or work.</i>	<i>-intentionally misleading sources/references, finding information on the 'net and taking credit for it, etc.</i>
Testing Misconduct	<i>Deliberately using tactics to simplify tests or testing situations.</i>	<i>-missing a test without a valid reason, using inappropriate electronics (headphones, Ipods, calculators, etc) to help with answers</i>

This is a broad outline of the Academic Integrity that LdBSS demands. Simply, do your own work to the best of your ability. **It is the student's responsibility to follow the rules of each class** and to ask the teacher if they have any questions.

Consequences

When there is evidence that a student knowingly broke the rules of LdBSS's Academic Integrity Code of Conduct the Principal and a parent/guardian will be notified; and the incident will be investigated. Possible consequences for academic integrity include, but are not limited to: deducted marks, 'zeros', redoing work at the teacher's or Principal's convenience (lunch times, spare, 3:30, etc.), and in extreme cases, failure and/or removal from the course.
