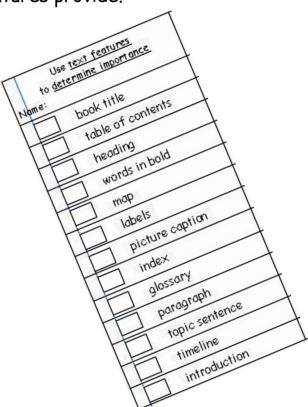
Use **Text Features**

as a means to determine importance and to locate specific details.

Students need to be explicitly taught that non-fiction text features are an excellent way to understand **main ideas** and to locate specific information.

To use the following black line master, have students go on a scaven-ger hunt in their text looking for examples of each of the listed text features. When found, students should <u>write the page number</u> in the <u>box</u> beside the feature. While working with a partner or in a small group, have students discuss the usefulness of each text feature. You may want to make a class chart for student reference in the future.

As a follow up activity, have students skim through an article, reading and viewing the text features only. Have them provide the main idea of this article that these features provide.
